Our Positivity Project character strength this week will be "Social Intelligence". Social Intelligence refers to a person's ability to understand and manage personal relationships. It is distance from a person's IQ or 'book smarts'. It includes an individual's ability to understand, and act on, the feelings, thoughts, and behaviors of other people. This type of intelligence can take place 'in the moment' of face-to-face conversations but also appears during times of deliberate thinking. It involves emotional intelligence and self-awareness.

Examples of social intelligence include knowing when to talk or listen, what to say, and what to do. Timing is a big part of social intelligence. For example, someone who is imperceptive, may tell a funny joke – but at the wrong time, or not show enough interest when meeting someone new.

Why is social intelligence important? Social intelligence helps individuals build relationships – and is important to numerous aspects of a person's life. It allows an individual to form friendships and alliances. And, it assists a person against being taken advantage of. People with social intelligence can 'read' other people's faces and know what motivates them. Social intelligence builds over time and as a person ages.

We are looking forward to a fantastic week at Lead Mine and we cannot wait to see our favorite students and families throughout the week.

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
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"ALL FOR BOOKS" COIN DRIVE February 4th-8th, 2019

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
