PTA Meeting Minutes

October 13, 2017

1. Welcome and Approval of Minutes (Tara Pleasant)

• Reviewed minutes from August PTA meeting. Minutes approved.

2. Principal's Report (Aaron Marcin)

- Thanked all for being at meeting. Just left Fitness Friday, which is going well. Kindergarteners will start participating in Fitness Friday in a couple of weeks.
- Parent/teacher conferences are coming up. Be on the lookout for a schedule. Will be setting a long term and a short term goal for each student.
- School is participating in Positivity Project and recently had sponsors and promoters of program come to LME: an Olympic medalist, Rubicon founder. Ms. Brautman did a great job on artwork for the project.
- 3rd grade teachers are using EL in their classrooms. We are a model school for the new EL curriculum. Had county reps here this week. EL is a social justice curriculum integrating social studies into literacy. The curriculum is hard. Mr. Marcin has been co-teaching with 3rd grade teachers. The students are enjoying the curriculum also.
- Saturday is grounds day. We have 50 azaleas to plant and lots of mulch to put out.
- More new security cameras have been installed. We now have 16 cameras and 24 hour security.
- 4th graders going on a field trip today.

3. President's Report – Communications, Membership, Treasurer (Tara Pleasant)

 those products. He is glad to be a part of the school. Rick also commended the
 PTA for trying to go paperless and do communication more electronically. When
 his prior school did that they saw parent commitment and participation
 plummet.

4. Services Report (Leslie Blackwood & Cami Stephens)

Leslie Blackwood

- LME is beginning the process of being Bring Your Own Device School. We want to have enough devices for all students. The rollout for BYOD will begin with three classrooms, then progress to three grade levels. We want to have a ratio of 1:1 with students and technology. Our school will be receiving 340 Chrome books to support this initiative.
- Mentoring Program: Staff and parents are invited to spend 20 minutes per week with a student who has been nominated by his/her teacher. Grades 3-5 are participating but K-2 would also like to participate. If we had more volunteers we could expand the program. Encouraged parents to participate by coming to have lunch with student, hang out from 8:00-8:30 am with student, etc.
